In 2005, the first Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (DNR) Green Tier agreements were signed, providing a framework to pursue environmental progress with a commitment to continuous improvement. Growing to over 100 participants and 4 charters, the Green Tier program focuses on building trust and developing a shared path for participants to achieve superior environmental and economical performance.

The Green Tier program helps benefit businesses, the environment and the community. Businesses throughout Wisconsin in good environmental standing can apply to the program. Once participants are accepted into the program, the business works together with DNR to find credible and creative ways to enable their business to be a powerful, sustainable force for environmental good and enhance productivity, cut costs and strengthen the health of the business and community.

Green Tier participants are provided a designated DNR single point of contact to help navigate programs and connect opportunities and resources to help achieve environmental objectives and are granted the option of reduced inspection frequency and limited civil immunity in the case of voluntary disclosure.

By adopting or utilizing a functional environmental management system, participants integrate environmental performance into regular decision making moving from compliance to continual improvement, going beyond existing compliance-based programs.
